

# HG KIDS GO GUIDE DOERS OF THE WORD

## STARTING POINT

What does it show to others if we say we love God but do not obey His Word? Why are good works important to show our faith?

Parent Helps (PH): Starting Point is designed as a conversation starter. This section allows you to introduce big concepts in simple questions.

PH: The True North section is designed to point us to God's Word. This section allows you to disciple your family by opening the Bible together.

#### TRAIL MARKERS

PH: Trail Markers are designed to get your family talking about important issues. This section allows you to see what your family thinks and believes about who God is.

1. How does God help us live out our faith?

PH: When we trust Jesus, He gives us the Holy Spirit who helps us live holy lives. By allowing the Holy Spirit to help us do what is good and right, people who trust Jesus can show they really believe in Him. Read Hebrews 13:20-21

2. What good is it to listen to God's Word but not do what it says?

PH: James says that if we listen to God's teaching but don't do what it says, we fool ourselves. When we listen and take action, we will be blessed. Works is proof that our faith is real. What sets us apart from demons is not that we believe God exists but that we have faith in Him and live to honor Him. Read James 2:18-19

3. How does our obedience to God's Word relate to how much we trust Him?

PH: What we believe affects how we live. We sit in a chair or ride in a car because we believe it is safe and reliable. We brush our teeth because we believe in doing so will keep cavities away. We obey God's Word because we trust that He is Lord, and He is good. Read Ephesians 2:8-10

## END POINT

PH: Jesus said, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word" (John 14:23). James reminded believers to be doers of the word. Jesus rescues us from sin and frees us to live a life that honors God. By doing what is good and right, people who trust Jesus can show that they really believe in Him.
