PAUL MET JESUS

STARTING POINT

Why do you think God chose to save a man like Paul?

Is anything too hard for God? Is anyone too evil to be changed by His grace?

Parent Helps (PH): Starting Point is designed as a conversation starter. This section allows you to introduce big concepts in simple questions.

TRUE NORTH

Acts 8-9

PH: The True North section is designed to point us to God's Word. This section allows you to disciple your family by opening the Bible together.

TRAIL MARKERS

PH: Trail Markers are designed to get your family talking about important issues. This section allows you to see what your family thinks and believes about who God is.

1. Why was Ananias nervous about going to Saul? What happened to Saul because Ananias obeyed God?

PH: Ananias knew what Saul had done in Jerusalem to Christians and why he had come to Damascus. Once Ananias obeyed God, Saul received his sight, but he also received Jesus as his Savior. Saul followed in baptism and learned from the Christians in Damascus.

2. Why do you think God chose to use Paul to spread the gospel?

PH: God chose to save and use Paul because this was a way to display His power. Sometimes we think certain people are "too bad" to be saved. This is not the case. Nothing is impossible for God. We all have sinned, and God's power and love are greater than the power of sin in our lives. Choosing Paul was a way for God to show His power and control of all things.

3. What are ways you think you need to change to be more like Jesus?

PH: Discuss your own need for God's grace and mercy found in a relationship with Jesus. Talk through your own flaws and struggles. Remind kids that the Holy Spirit changes all believers over time to be more like Jesus. Pray that God will show you areas in your life that He wants to change to be like Christ.

END POINT

PH: Jesus appeared to Saul and changed him inside and out. Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners. (1 Timothy 1:15) Jesus called Paul, who was once an enemy to Christians, to spend the rest of his life telling people the gospel and leading them to trust in Jesus.
