CALL TO WORSHIP

The Scriptural call to worship at the beginning of our service reminds us of the centrality of God's Word. God reveals Himself to us through His Word and invites us to respond corporately to Him in worship.

I will give thanks to You, O Lord, among the peoples; I will sing praises to You among the nations. For Your steadfast love is great above the heavens; Your faithfulness reaches to the clouds. Be exalted, O God, above the heavens! Let Your glory be over all the earth!

CORPORATE CONFESSION

In light of God's holiness, wrath, and grace, we acknowledge that we have all sinned against God and are in need of His sanctifying grace. This confession occurs in the context of a covenant relationship made possible through the perfect life, substitutionary death, and victorious resurrection of Jesus. As Christians, our confession is not so that God should forgive us, but because, through Christ, He has already forgiven us.

For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, slaves to various passions and pleasures, passing our days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating one another. But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior.

OFFERING

Giving is an act of worship in which the members of Hickory Grove give generously of our substance to further the mission of the church and to bring glory to God.

THE GOSPEL IN THE CHURCH

The Apostle Paul warned the Colossians not to shift their hope away from the Gospel (1:23). He did this because he knew that Christians and Christian churches should never leave the Gospel in favor of something else. As many have said, *the Gospel is not the ABC's of Christianity but the A to Z*. At Hickory Grove, we believe the Gospel is fundamental to everything we do as a church. Here's why:

The Gospel fuels our Worship

Purchased by His blood and redeemed by His grace, we lift up our voices to the one who was lifted up on the cross. We rise to worship on Sunday because Jesus rose from the grave on a Sunday. We pray corporately as a reminder that Jesus shed His blood to make us one. The Lord's Supper is a powerful reminder of our commitment to Jesus and to each other. So too is baptism. We go under the water because Jesus went under God's judgment for us. We rise from the water because Jesus rose from the dead so we could walk in newness of life. We worship the Father in spirit and truth because we've been sealed with the Spirit and now walk in the truth. Therefore, our praise on earth is a foreshadow of the praise to be offered in heaven.¹

The Gospel Informs our Discipleship

The Gospel makes us humble, reminding us that we are sinners in need of the grace of discipleship and training. Discipleship helps us to grow up in every way in Christ. Our marriages should *reflect* the Gospel (Eph 5:22-33), our parenting should *communicate* the Gospel (2 Tim 3:15, Eph 6:4), our work ethic should *illustrate* the Gospel (Col 4:23-24), and our lives should be *marked* by the Gospel (Gal 2:20). All of this requires our discipleship to be infused *with* the Gospel.

The Gospel Clarifies our Mission

Jesus came to seek and to save the lost. The Gospel reminds us that sin is the enemy, the cross is the remedy, and the world is our mission field. Therefore, the Gospel is both our motivation and our message. It is a message for all people and therefore we go to all people, prioritizing those with little to no access to the Gospel (1 Cor 15:20). Scripture teaches that God sent Jesus to live among the people He wanted to save. In a similar way, we are sent local and abroad to live among the people we want God to save. For Jesus, this involved leaving the comforts of heaven to live in less than ideal situations. So too, our mission may involve leaving the comforts of the familiar to live in the confines of the inconvenient. The incarnation of Jesus calls us to go by faith and once we go, it reminds us to stay by faith too.

At Hickory Grove, the Gospel fuels our worship, informs our discipleship, and clarifies our mission.

It is time for our church to prioritize personal ownership of the Great Commission as we each **intentionally pursue one person** with the hope of the Gospel.

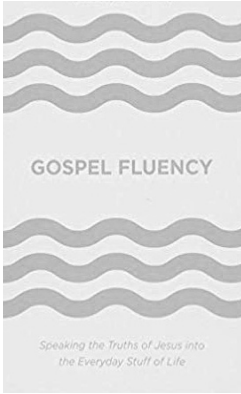

Gospel Fluency:
Speaking the Truths of Jesus into the
Everyday Stuff of Life **by Jeff Vanderstelt**

Even if they want to, many Christians find it hard to talk to others about Jesus. Is it possible this difficulty is because we're trying to speak a language we haven't actually spent time practicing?

To become fluent in a new language, you must immerse yourself in it until you actually start to think about life through it. Becoming fluent in the Gospel happens the same way—after believing it, we have to intentionally rehearse it (to ourselves and to others) and immerse ourselves in its truths. Only then will we start to see how everything in our lives, from the mundane to the magnificent, is transformed by the hope of the Gospel.

SCRIPTURE MEMORY

During the Romans sermon series, take the challenge to memorize different verses from Romans. The Scripture memory passages are:

For I am not ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made.
