CALL TO WORSHIP

The Scriptural call to worship at the beginning of our service reminds us of the centrality of God's Word. God reveals Himself to us through His Word and invites us to respond corporately to Him in worship.

CORPORATE CONFESSION

In light of God's holiness, wrath, and grace, we acknowledge that we have all sinned against God and are in need of His sanctifying grace. This confession occurs in the context of a covenant relationship made possible through the perfect life, substitutionary death, and victorious resurrection of Jesus. As Christians, our confession is not so that God should forgive us, but because, through Christ, He has already forgiven us.

Keep back Your servant also from presumptuous sins; let them not have dominion over me! Then I shall be blameless, and innocent of great transgression. Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in Your sight, O Lord, my Rock and my Redeemer.

OFFERING

Giving is an act of worship in which the members of Hickory Grove give generously of our substance to further the mission of the church and to bring glory to God.

MAN FALLING SHORT

The Gospel is God's response to the problem of sin. In fact, we can't interpret the Bible rightly without a firm understanding of what it means to be totally depraved. The doctrine of sin, then, is foundational in constructing a Christian worldview. Paul wrote that every human being has fallen short of the glory of God (Rom 3:23). Meaning, although we were created to reflect God, we have chosen rather to rebel against him.

Man falls short *Naturally*

The Bible teaches that we are sinners by nature, or as David put it, we were brought forth in iniquity (Ps 51:5). Scripture teaches that we were born dead in our trespasses and sins (Eph 2:1). Theologians call this Original Sin, and its effects are inescapable. Original sin is both an event and a condition. The original sin occurred when Adam and Eve disobeyed God in the Garden (event), but now by consequence, all humanity has an inherent bias toward sin (condition).

Man falls short *Morally*

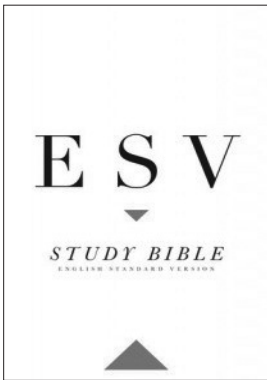
Our actions demonstrate our sinfulness. In fact, the word sin in the New Testament carries the idea of missing the bullseye. Anything that does not perfectly conform to the moral law of God is sin. The numerous vice lists in scripture provide painful examples of individual sins and stand as a clear condemnation over all humanity (See Gal 5:19-21, Rom 1:29-32, Col 3:5-9, Titus 3:3).

Man falls short *Mentally*

Not only do our actions betray us, but our minds do as well. Theologians call this the noetic effects of the fall, how sin affects our minds. A few examples are forgetfulness, ignorance, distractedness, prejudice, inconsistency, pride, and intellectual apathy. We often think higher of ourselves than we should and lower of God than we ought. Even our praise falls short of fully appreciating the glory of God. As Shai Linne once said, Our highest thought is infinitely unworthy of him.

The Doctrine of Sin shows us our need for a savior. Thankfully, Jesus lived a sinless life and died a sinner's death. Morally, he resisted sin to the point of shedding his own blood (Heb 12:4). Mentally, he always desired to please his Father (John 6:38), and naturally, as the God-Man, he bypassed Adam's sinful nature. The doctrine of sin may be dark and bleak, but it lends itself to the light of Christ and fixes our gaze on the cross of Calvary.
