CALL TO WORSHIP

The Scriptural call to worship at the beginning of our service reminds us of the centrality of God's Word. God reveals Himself to us through His Word and invites us to respond corporately to Him in worship.

CORPORATE CONFESSION

In light of God's holiness, wrath, and grace, we acknowledge that we have all sinned against God and are in need of His sanctifying grace. This confession occurs in the context of a covenant relationship made possible through the perfect life, substitutionary death, and victorious resurrection of Jesus. As Christians, our confession is not so that God should forgive us, but because, through Christ, He has already forgiven us.

O Lord, the great and awesome God, who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love Him and keep His commandments, we have sinned and done wrong and acted wickedly and rebelled, turning aside from your commandments and rules.

To us, O Lord, belongs open shame, to our kings, to our princes, and to our fathers, because we have sinned against You. To the Lord our God belong mercy and forgiveness, for we have rebelled against Him.

THE LORD'S SUPPER: A GUIDE FOR THE CHURCH

What is The Lord's Supper?

The night before Jesus' crucifixion, He sat down with His disciples to celebrate the Passover meal. This meal commemorated the pivotal event in Exodus 12 when God "passed over" His people in Egypt who put the blood of a lamb over their doorposts.

While celebrating this Passover meal, Jesus took the bread from the table, broke it, and said, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." He then took a cup and gave it to them saying, "Drink of it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

Jesus did this to symbolize His impending death on a cross, which would bring about the forgiveness of sins for many. Furthermore, He commanded His disciples to continually enjoy this meal in remembrance of His sacrifice on the cross.

The Apostle Paul in 1 Corinthians 11, and subsequently many Christians today, refer to this meal as "The Lord's Supper," for it was instituted by Jesus and celebrates the memory of His sacrificial death. In addition, we consider The Lord's Supper an ordinance of the church because Christ ordained that it be performed.

Who should partake in The Lord's Supper?

The Scripture is clear that The Lord's Supper is a sign of continuing in the Christian life and is therefore reserved for those who have placed their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Thus, those who have not placed their faith in Christ and publicly declared this faith through the ordinance of baptism should abstain.

Furthermore, the Apostle Paul warns of participating in an "unworthy manner" (1 Corinthians 11:27). He calls all Christians to first examine themselves and their relationships in the body of Christ, lest they "eat and drink judgment upon themselves" (1 Corinthians 11:29). That is, Paul is teaching that we must come to the table with a repentant heart, both toward the Lord and our brothers and sisters in Christ.

PRACTICAL THEOLOGY: GRACE

Grace is one of the greatest words in the Christian's vocabulary! Grace plays a primary theme in God's story and is a primary attribute for God himself. He is the God of all Grace (1 Peter 5:10) and, from our perspective, the beauty of His grace shines brightest against the backdrop of our sin and death, thus making the gospel the greatest depiction of grace.

WHAT IT IS:

The New Testament teaches that grace saves us (Eph 2:7-8), trains us (Titus 2:11-12), empowers us (2 Tim 2:1), and reigns in us (Rom 5:21). Grace does what the Law cannot. The Law commands our obedience and condemns our disobedience. Grace, on the other hand, pardons our disobedience and empowers our obedience. The Law teaches that the wages of sin is death, but grace teaches us that the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord (Rom 6:23).


WHY IT MATTERS:

Grace changes how we worship. Every song we sing highlights the grace of God to rescue sinners from the penalty and power of sin. We will worship God with gratitude, awe, and wonder when we understand what our good and gracious God did to save us.

Grace changes how we live. We were dead in our sins, but God's grace made us alive in Christ. Motivated by His kindness and empowered by His Spirit, we live to honor Christ in all that we say and do.

Grace changes how we evangelize. The grace of God fuels our mission. We share with coworkers, family members, neighbors, and the nations because we have a vision of God sitting atop a throne of grace (Heb 4:16) in which He gladly extends salvation to those who repent and believe the gospel.
